


Sport North Federation supports its members to provide quality sport opportunities throughout the NWT.

## Sport North AGM- Strengthen our Members' Capacity Through Targeted Services & Supports

The Sport North AGM was held May 24-25, 2024, in Yellowknife. The theme of the AGM was Celebrating our Volunteers – Together we are Stronger than ever. The AGM opened on Friday evening which included the opening of the Sport North Board of Director Nominations. The evening closed with guest Speaker, Olympic Kayak Champion Adam Kreek sharing thought-provoking and inspiring content.

Adam Kreek also spoke during a lunchtime workshop designed to inspire and appreciate the TSO Volunteers. This session focused on cultivating leadership, enhancing teamwork and fostering personal growth.

A new addition to the AGM was a Partners Showcase. It was an opportunity for our TSO's, Partners, and those in the industry to showcase what is happening within their organizations.

The Sport North Board met six times over the past fiscal year, with a primary focus on updating the strategic governance framework and SNF Bylaws. There are 8 board members and at minimum 2 staff who attend the board meetings.

Other highlights included National Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21st) – light standard banners ongoing display by the City of Yellowknife, promoting the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action for Sport

### Awards- Celebrate NWT's Sport Accomplishments and Heroes

25 Award nominations were received, with nominations submitted in every category. We worked with Joey Klein and ArTech to design and create the awards, the Federation is happy to support local businesses and northern artists.

All award categories were presented. One highlight was the presentation of Senior Male Athlete of the Year to two co- recipients, brothers-in-law James Williams and Byron Kotokak which has traditionally never happened, but the nomination selection committee made an exception in this unique circumstance.

### Coaching - Advance Sport Through Volunteer Growth & Coach Development

Coaching Assoc of Canada – 29 NWT coaches engaged taking NCCP modules through our partner Alberta Sport's Multi Sport Calendar.

Direct coach support provided to 21 enquiring NWT coaches PTCR (Provincial / Territorial Coaching Representative) Spider Jones fully participated in online and in-person Coaching Association of Canada meetings, additionally sitting on the National Coaches Week offerings working committee.

Partnership established with Pacific Sport Vancouver Island securing seats in its vaulted eightmonth virtual program providing coaches with NCCP courses, applied coaching workshops, and mentorship! Thorsten Gohl (Table Tennis), Jeffrey Watson (Badminton), Joe Campeau (Hockey), Effie Lockhart (Swimming) – Graduated May 2025!

The She Can Coach Grant provides financial assistance to those coaches who identify as female, to help build their coaching pathway and their coaching education/training at all levels. Female AWG's Coaches are also highlighted through social media and receive an appreciation gift (i.e. She Can Coach swag).

The They Can Coach program similarly targets coaches looking to take their game to the next level supporting coaches financially to heighten their skill sets, develop peer networks, and become role models for other NWT aspiring coaches (i.e. at Arctic Winter Games, Canada Winter Games, Canada Summer Games).

### **Gender Equity - Canadian Women in Sport Poster Campaign**

to clarify gender equity challenges faced within NWT Sport, to be followed up in 2025-26 with action to address determined priorities. This follow - up did happen on May 25, 2025, in conjunction with the SNF AGM.

Land Acknowledgement Webinar on September 24th, Sport North partnered with SIRC to host a webinar titled, Enhancing the Impact of Land Acknowledgements in Canadian Sport.

Michelle Good shared her knowledge and experience on how we can approach land acknowledgements with greater purpose and intention. Truth and Reconciliation – Michelle Good Land Acknowledgements Indigenous author / poet /activist Michelle Good (https://www.michellegood.ca/) was engaged to address Canada's greater sport community to assist in better revealing truth, and inspiring reconciliation though land acknowledgements... with the intended outcome of how to better craft / revise / strengthen their meaning, intention, and delivery. Her September 24, 2025 'Enhancing the Impact of Land Acknowledgements in Canadian Sport', hosted in partnership with Sport North Federation and SIRC (Sport Information Resource Centre) was reported as being insightful and thought- provoking.

In addition, we continue to partner with:

National LGBTQ Sport Inclusion Task Force: ongoing SNF representation, focused on developing the formal role our Sport Federation can play to support this national task force.

National Parasport Collective – ongoing SNF representation, with an eye to supporting Para Sport development within the NWT

Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action for Sport, with LGBTQ Sport Inclusion Task Force work, to focus on supporting/including/embracing 2 Spirited individuals within the NWT, generating action planning around inclusive and welcoming sport environments for BIPOC, LGBTQ, and Newcomers to NWT Sport.

### KidSport NWT - Reduce Barriers for Children & Youth Through KidSport

KidSport NWT has continued with expanding upon our marketing strategy to promote our grant programs. This effort has increased our viewership and interactions by impressions, actions and website clicks from last year. This has led to more applications and grants from the previous year, setting another new record.

In the last year, KidSport awarded over 90 individual grants for registration and equipment, making up 58% of our total support, a 15% increase compared to the average of the last five years. These grants supported 14 sports across 10 communities. KidSport NWT broadened its reach, extending support to four previously unserved communities this year.
