I would like to start by thanking the Board, TSO's and SNF Staff for their dedication in moving Sport Forward. Now that Covid restrictions have been lifted, I am heartened with the fact that we will be able to meet in person. Being together is beneficial to share information. The coffee breaks also seem to generate some healthy discussion and it will be nice to see everyone together again.

Please find below a summary of the Federation's progress this year.

WCLC Funding Agreement

The 2023-2026 WCLC – Physical Activity, Sport and Recreation Fund Letter was sent to MACA – SRY, on March 1st.

The document centers on the programs in the 2020-2023 Application and allowed SNF the opportunity to provide an outline of Sport North Programs and Services for the 2023 - 2026 annual contribution of \$800,000.00 of WCL – Physical Activity, Sport and Recreation Fund.

Games Games Games

The Staff and TSO's have had a full schedule of Multi-Sport Games since the last AGM. The 2022 Canada Summer Games August 6-21 in the Niagara Region, the 2023 AWG's January 29- February 5 in Wood Buffalo, AB. and finally, the 2023 Canada Winter Games February 18 – March 5, in PEI. Right



around the corner are the 2024 AWG's March 10-16 in Matsu-Borough, Alaska. The AWG TSO's met May 3rd to discuss the '23 AWG's and ideas on the 2024 AWG Territorial Trials selection process and hosting sites. The Games are right around the corner so early planning is critical in ensuing Team NT is prepared. Lastly with the 2024 AWG's, please inform your athletes/Coaches to have their passports updated as we always seem to have participants sitting on pins and needles, waiting for their documents.

I would like to thank the TSO's and sport/host committees for their efforts throughout the year. We always learn something new with these events and continue to look at ways to ensure the preparation, selection and delivery of Team NT is successful and Athlete Centered.

Multisport Games Manual

As a reminder, on December 10, 2021, MACA distributed the first draft of the Multi-Sport Games Manual and requested feedback from the TSO's.

The purpose of the Manual is to have policies in place for all those involved in any of the Major Games Team NT participates in (Arctic Winter Games, Canada Games, North American Indigenous Games).

The Multi-Sport Games Committee hopes to share draft two with the TSO's with a goal to implement the Manual for the 2025 Canada Summer Games.

SNF Strategic Plan

The Federation contracted C. Sparks Consulting (Caroline Sparks) to lead the Board in creating the 2023-2028 Strategic Plan. Work began October '22 with the SNF Staff and Board initiating discussion and navigating through the Strategic Planning World. Since our first meeting, Caroline has met several times with Staff and Board, ending with a Strategic Planning



session April 14-16 in Inuvik. All SNF Board Members and Staff were in attendance, and the exchange was valuable. Immediately after the planning session in Inuvik, TSO's received a survey on April 19th. The feedback from the TSO's will be useful in creating the Strategic Plan. Caroline will be providing an overview of the final version this weekend.

Special Projects

SNF takes on Special Projects with the objective of ensuring that there is a direct OR indirect benefit to the TSO. Spider leads most of SNF's Special Projects and his work in this area is to be commended. Below is a summary of what's transpired in this area over the year:

Common Vision – Breaking the Cycle Version 3, targeting kindergarten and Jr. kindergarten teachers to widen their skill set to include purposefully establishing physical literacy foundations amongst their students included.

- NWT Teachers Association Conference trade show engagement alongside Aurora College Early Childhood Educators, followed with a Being, Belonging, Becoming online professional development webinar, and subsequent Community of Practice (CoP) inline sessions targeting shared challenges.
- Beaufort Delta Early Years Active Play professional development in person Inuvik Active Play workshop widely attended by Jr. K/K teachers, with program monies being used to fly in and accommodate remote participants.
- In-person staff support at the Tuktoyaktuk Child Development Centre

National LGBTQ Sport Inclusion Task Force & National Parasport Collective – ongoing SNF representation

National Indigenous Day (June 21st) —light standard banners produced, then graciously erected for free by the City of Yellowknife, displaying Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action for Sport.



Canadian Women in Sport – Gender Equity pilot orchestration with participation by NWT Soccer, and scheduled subsequent engagement by Speed Skating NWT, NWT Softball, NWT Kayak Association and NWT Squash... in turn supporting gender equity obligations obliged of TSOs by MACA and backing up the GNWT to meet its Red Deer Accord obligations around gender equity.

Communication & Marketing
